

# THE KING OF BEASTS

An Exceptional Renaissance Gem from the Marlborough Collection

This exhibition focuses on a single gem. But what a gem! It is a large cameo of a lion's head skilfully carved in semi-transparent cat's eye in pale green to yellow.

The honey-colored tone evokes the fur of the lion. The frontally faced head is cut in high relief, showing off the flowing mane, the teeth, and the indentations of the pupils. Cameos of such superb sculptural quality and craftsmanship, like that of the lion's head, were mostly carved in Milan in northern Italy and exported to the Courts of Europe in Florence, Paris, Prague, and Madrid. This one compares with masks of the important Miseroni workshops.

Provenance is second only to artistic quality, and this gem has it in spades. We can trace it all the way back to the most important gem collectors of the seventeenth century. It is documented in a drawing now in Princes Czartoryski Museum in Kraków that was commissioned by Baron Philipp von Stosch (1691-1757) an eminent collector and antiquarian who lived in Italy and accrued a collection of 3500 gems. It was subsequently acquired by the great gem collector George Spencer, the 4th Duke of Marlborough (1739-1817). His collection of 800 gems, considered the most important and finest of its time, was housed at Blenheim Palace, Oxfordshire. It was finally disbursed in 1899. Marlborough gems are now found in museum collections throughout the world — the Getty Museum, the Musée du Louvre, the British Museum, among others.

Lions are King of the Beasts, and images of them are often frightening, but this lion is anything but scary. Rather he resembles the Cowardly Lion in the fictional Land of Oz. In this exhibition our Marlborough Lion keeps company with felines from various artistic media of all epochs, from antiquity to pop art, from literature to modern and contemporary jewelry, including David Webb, William Burgess, and Cocteau.

Founded by Dr. Sandra Hindman over thirty years ago and with locations in Paris, Chicago, and New York, *Les Enluminures* has forged long-standing relationships with major museums and prestigious private collections throughout the world. It exhibits at TEFAF Maastricht, Frieze Masters London and Seoul, and the Winter Show, and organizes three to four exhibitions in its gallery spaces annually. The gallery is well-known for the level of its scholarship but also for the diversity, high quality, and provenance of the works it offers for sale.
